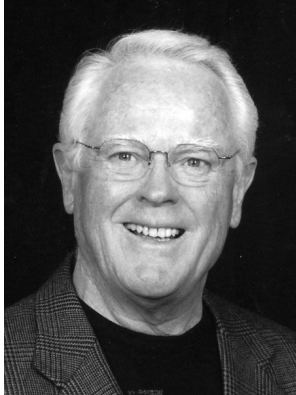

It was the word "dancer" on a license plate at St. Paul Apostle Catholic Church that caught the eye of Jerry and his wife, Harol Hoffman, three years



ago. Both were heavily into folk dancing, especially Norwegian and Swedish, and more recently into swing, so ballroom dancing was a natural next step to which fellow church members, Audrey and Ralph Mawyer, happily introduced them.

"Not knowing a fox trot from a samba, we had a steep hill to climb," Jerry says.

"We soon became regulars at club dances and the Grange which we joined and have profited from both activities."

More recently they have enjoyed the challenges of Wayne and Marie Crowder's workshops in International Style ballroom dancing, but "We strongly hang on to our non-competitive dancing posture," he says. "We had competed too long in the workplace (and formerly road races) to change from an enjoyable hobby to a competitive one."
