On Dance Etiquette: Why Dance with Beginners?

"When in Rome, do as the Romans do" is an ancient adage but a good one to remember when attending dances in the Triad.

As we welcome new dancers almost weekly, several couples have suggested including a note in this publication re dancing etiquette, at least as it is practiced at Triad dances.

The custom at dinner dances as well as club dances is for men to dance with every lady at his table. "I prefer to dance with the lady I brought" is a male's common objection. There's no question that dancing with a better partner makes both dancers look good, but it is not the best way to improve lead/follow skills.

Suppose you are a great leader or follower. If leaders dance only with accomplished followers, your lead-and-follow skills gradually decline. You learn to dance better by dancing with more experienced partners, but you learn how to lead/follow better by dancing with those who are less experienced. All your weaknesses as a leader show up when dancing with a novice who fails to follow your lead. The same is true for followers.

It is a proven fact that a man or woman cannot become a great dancer by dancing only with the same person. A leader who only wants to dance with the best followers may feel they are the only ones who can match his high level of skill. Often what is really going on is that only the best followers can compensate for his mistakes. If none but the best can follow your lead, dance professionals respectfully suggest your leads could use some work.

There may be a chorus of objections to the idea of dancing with all the ladies at your table, especially when you are seated with seven or more couples; however, you will miss only seven dances with your partner out of approximately 50 selections on the evening's schedule. And you may find several ladies as competent as you are as you widen your circle of dancers.. You may also discover a weakness in your lead which eventually will make you a better dancer.

(If you disagree with any of the above, we welcome your rebuttal. Please let us know by either signed or anonymous communication. We value your opinion.)

Become Involved: Have you ever heard members complain, "No one ever asks me to do anything!" If so, please ask, "Well, what do you want to do?" Our chapter is composed of members with a variety of talents which can greatly enhance our organization, but you have to take the first step, indicating a willingness to serve. You will be glad you did.
